Market Update

Highlights

Inflation: Somali Shilling (SOS)-using areas: Consumer Price Index (CPI) increased (3-4%) in October and November 2021 in central, southern regions and northeast regions. Compared to the five-year average for October and November (2016-2020), CPI increased significantly (18-35%) across all regions of Somalia due to higher prices of sorghum (the main local cereal used in the consumption basket) and increases in imported food prices this year.

Somaliland Shilling (SLS)-using areas: CPI declined slightly (1%) in northwest regions both in October and November 2021. However, CPI increased slightly (2-3%) in northwest regions compared to the five year average for October and November (2016-2020).

Exchange rate: SOS-using areas: Exchange rates between SOS and the United States Dollar (USD) remained relatively stable in most regions of Somalia in October and November 2021. Compared to the five-year averages for October and November, SOS depreciated at moderate rates (5-11%) in central and southern regions of the country in October and November 2021. However, SOS depreciated significantly against the USD in northeast region (34% both in October & November) due to continued circulation of large amount of locally printed SOS currency notes in these markets in recent years.

SIS-using areas: the exchange rate between SLS and USD remained stable both in October and November 2021 but appreciated slightly (4%) compared to the five-year average for 2016-2020.

Local cereal (white maize, red sorghum and white sorghum prices): Local cereal prices mostly exhibited mild changes (≤ ±5% - mostly increases) in most regions of the country in October and November 2021. Specifically, white maize prices increased in Banadir (1-9%), Juba Valley (3-5%) but decreased mildly in Shabelle (5% in October). However, white maize price in Shabelle increased moderately (18%) in November 2021. Red sorghum prices increased in northeast (1-6%), Sorghum Belt (1-7%) and Central (4%) while white sorghum prices increased slightly

in northwest regions (2% in October and November 2021)) and moderately in Hiran (9% in November 2021)). These increases can be attributed to reduced market supply because of low carryover stock from recent consecutive poor harvests and poor harvest prospects at the end of the current Deyr season. Similarly, compared to the five-year averages for October and November (2016-2020), local cereal prices in October and November 2021 were higher (15-66%) in most regions due to reduced supply this year. Specifically, white maize prices increased in Banadir (23-32%), Juba (60-66%) and Shabelle (34-58%); red sorghum prices increased in central (16-25%), northeast (46-49%) and Sorghum Belt (56-64%); while white sorghum prices increased in northwest (15-19%) and Hiran (29-32%).

Prices of imported food items (rice, sugar, vegetable oil, wheat flour) exhibited mild to moderate ($\leq \pm 15\%$) changes (mostly increases) in October and November 2021 compared to a month ago across most regions of Somalia mainly attributable to increasing global prices. Compared to the five-year average, prices of most food imports were higher in most regions of Somalia: southern regions (7-25% for rice, 18-30% for sugar, 39-71% for vegetable oil and 16-32% for wheat flour); central regions (26% for rice, 23-25% for sugar, 44-52% for vegetable oil and 29-30% for wheat flour); and northwest (11-16% for rice, 6-13% November for sugar, 10-12% for vegetable oil and 7% for wheat flour). These price increases are mainly due to rising food prices on the international market this year. However, price of imported items were significantly higher compared to the five-year averages in northeast markets (52-56% for rice, 40-46% for sugar, 92-94% for vegetable oil and 57-62% for wheat flour). This is mainly due to depreciation of the local SOS currency as well as rising food prices on the international market this year.

Livestock (local quality goat and camel) prices mostly decreased at mild to moderate rates (\leq 15%) in October and November 2021. This is attributable to the deterioration of livestock body condition as a result of prevailing drought conditions in most region. However, compared to the five-year average, livestock prices in October and November remained higher in most regions of Somalia: south (6-32%), central (9-25%) and northwest (4-8%). Price increases were even higher in northeast regions (46-55%) due to the loss of purchasing value of the local currency this year. However, goat prices declined slightly in November 2021 compared to the five-year average in Sorghum-belt (2%), Banadir (6%) and Juba (12%) due to deterioration of body conditions. Milk prices (camel and cattle) mostly increased at mild rates (\leq ±10%) in October and November 2021 in most regions of the country due to reduced milk availability as a result of ongoing drought conditions. Compared to the five-year average for October and November (2016-2020), cattle milk prices mostly exhibited mild to moderate increases in south (10-32%) and central (up to 6%) but slightly lower in northwest (2-7%) and moderately decreased in northeast (16%) regions. On the other hand, camel milk prices exhibited mild increases across most regions (\leq ±11%) in October and November 2021. Compared to five-year average for October and November (2016-2020), camel milk prices mostly exhibited increases in south (4-21%) and northeast (11-13%) but decreased in northwest (up to 5%) and central (8-14%).

Labour (unskilled) wages remained relatively stable or changed at mild rates (≤± 7%; mostly increases) in most regions across the country in October and November 2021 compared to a month ago. Compared to the five-year average, labor wages are higher (2-58%) in most regions in October and November 2021. However, labour wage rates were lower in Juba (by 5% in October & 8% in November) compared to the five-year average due to the declining labour opportunities in the region as a result of active conflict in some of the areas.

Terms of Trade (ToT) between daily labour wage and cereals either remained stable or changed by ±1kg across all regions in both October and November 2021. Compared to the five-year average for October and November (2016-2020), ToT between daily labor and cereals mostly declined (1-5kgs) in most regions attributable to higher cereal prices this year. ToT between local quality goat and cereal prices exhibited a mixed trend in October and November 2021 across the country. TOT decreased in Banadir (1-15%), Sorghum Belt (6-15%) and Juba valley (15-19%) but in northeast increased (4% in October) and decreased (5% in November); while remaining stable in the central and northwest regions in October but increasing slightly (3%) in November 2021. On the other hand, compared to the five-year average for October and November (2016-2020), the ToT between local quality goat and cereals was lower in southern regions (14-48%) and northwest regions (5-10%) attributable to higher cereal prices this year while remaining more or less stable in central regions (0-4%) and in the northeast regions (2% or less).

Figure 1: Wheat Prices: Mogadishu and Bossaso Markets




Figure 2: Terms of Trade Between Wage Rates and Selected Cereals




Figure 4: Monthly Trends in Consumer Price Index (CPI, March 2007=100)




Figure 3: Monthly Exchange Rate for Selected Regions (SoSh and SISh to USD)





Figure 5: Monthly Trends in Local Cereal Prices

Figure 6: Trends in Cereal Prices





Figure 8: Imported Commodity Prices Compared to Exchange Rate






Figure 7: Trends in Wage Rates and Relative Purchasing Power




Figure 9: Goat Local Quality





Figure 11: Water Drum (200 litres)

Figure 12: Trends in Cereal Prices





Figure 14: Imported Commodity Prices Compared to Exchange Rate




Figure 15: Goat Local Quality

Figure 18: Trends in Cereal Prices




Figure 20: Imported Commodity Prices Compared to Exchange Rate




Figure 22: Exchange Rate




Figure 21: Goat Local Quality





Figure 23: Water Drum (200 litres)

Figure 24: Trends in Cereal Prices




Figure 25: Bakara: Trends in Wage Rates and Relative Purchasing Power




Figure 26: Imported Commodity Prices Compared to Exchange Rate




Figure 27: Goat Local Quality





Figure 29: Wheat Flour





Figure 32: Imported Commodity Prices Compared to Exchange Rate






Figure 31: Trends in wage rates and relative purchasing power




Figure 33: Goat Local Quality




Figure 35: Water Drum (200 litres) 20,000 19,000 18.000 17.000 16,000 16,000 15,000 14,000 13,000 12.000 11,000 10,000 . Mar Мау Average (2016 - 2020) - 2019 - 2020 - 2021

Figure 36: Trends in Cereal Prices




Figure 37: Trends in Wage Rates and Relative Purchasing Power







Figure 38: Imported Commodity Prices Compared to Exchange Rate

Figure 42: Trends in Cereal Prices




Figure 43: Trends in Wage Rates and Relative Purchasing Power




Figure 44: Imported Commodity Prices Compared to Exchange Rate




Figure 45: Goat Local Quality




Figure 46: Exchange Rate





Figure 47: Water Drum (200 litres)

Figure 48: Berbera Livestock Exports (Number of Heads)



